PROFILE:

I am a professor of woodwork at a college called <u>Gifu Academy of Forest Science and Culture (GAFSC)</u> since 2006. Gifu Academy is a higher educational institution established by Gifu prefectural government to provide practical multidisciplinary education in the fields of forestry, environmental education, wooden architecture, and woodwork. The objectives of the school are to produce graduates who can develop innovative and sustainable ways for communities and individuals to use forest and wood resources. GAFSC has a partnership agreement with the <u>University of Applied Forest Sciences Rottenburg</u> (Hochschule für Forstwirtschaft Rottenburg, HFR) in Germany.

I teach basic woodworking technique, how to use hand tools, how to make chairs, etc, at GAFSC. The average age of my students is in their 20's to 50's.

Besides teaching, I have several focus areas in my research. One is to preserve traditional skills of professional craftspeople and to pass them on to the next generation. For this purpose, I am building a network of woodworking educational institutes in Japan to develop the quality of education. Woodworking is taught at various institutes, such as vocational schools and art universities, but there is little exchanges among them.

In addition, I established a non-profit organization called <u>GINOWA</u> (meaning "circles of skills") in 2024 to help traditional craftspeople solve their problems.

Another focus area is to spread the joy of woodworking to a wide range of people through "green woodworking". Green woodworking is a way of making small crafts and simple furniture by using green wood and hand tools. I learned this method in the UK and started promoting it in Japan since 2006. The population of Japanese green woodworking fans keeps growing.
